What we will do

- [MOSS](#)
 - Comparing with past and current student's homeworks.
 - Every pair with a similarity or line match count significantly higher than average will be noticed.
 - In 2021 hw1, avg. of sim. is roughly under 10%.
 - Then we will manually check each pair.
 - MOSS and we don't just find longest substring, but take the code architecture into consideration.

- So some tricks such like changing variable name, indentation, variable type, or order of code blocks will not work.
